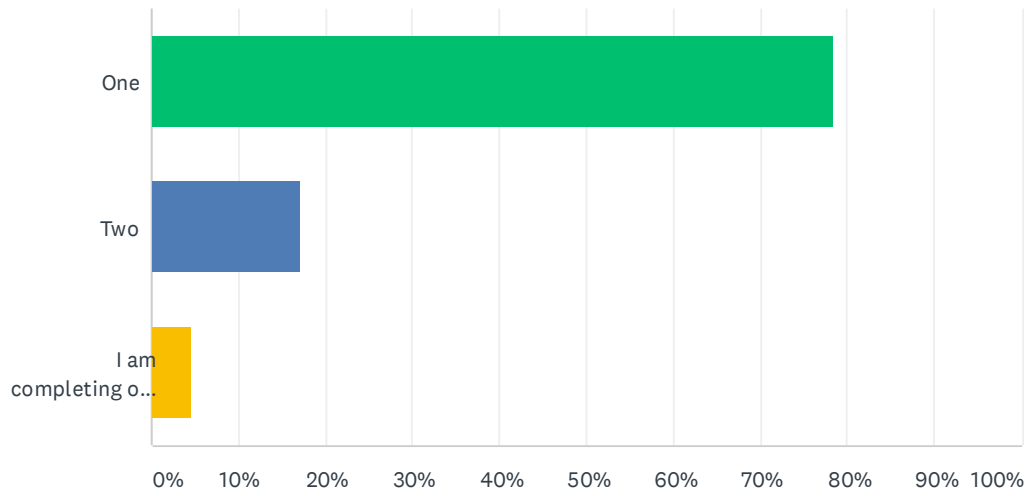


Q2 How many woodlots are registered to you as an individual or as an affiliated company?

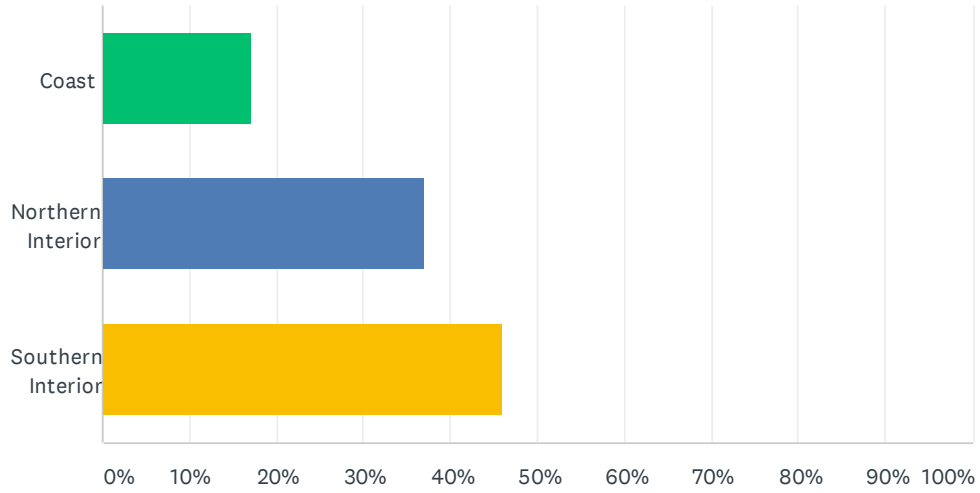

Q3 Where is your woodlot located?

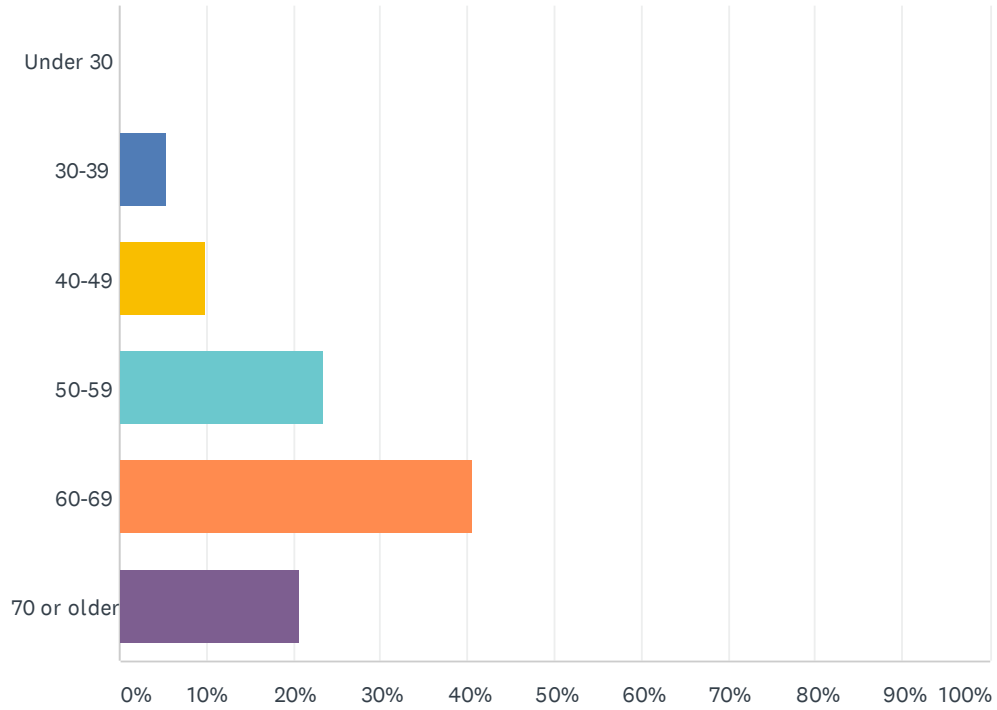

Q4 What is your age?

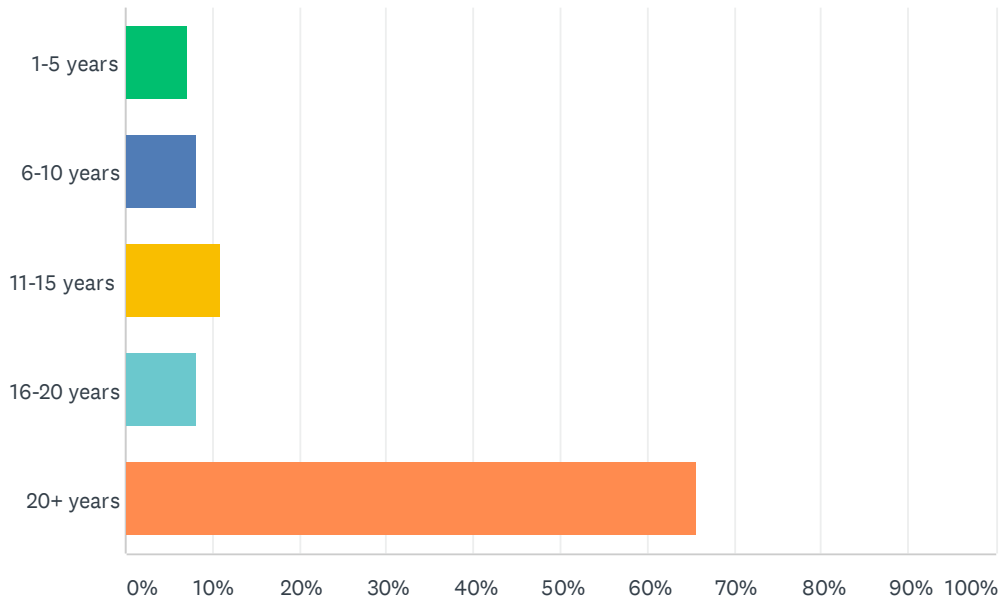

Q5 How long have you had your licence?

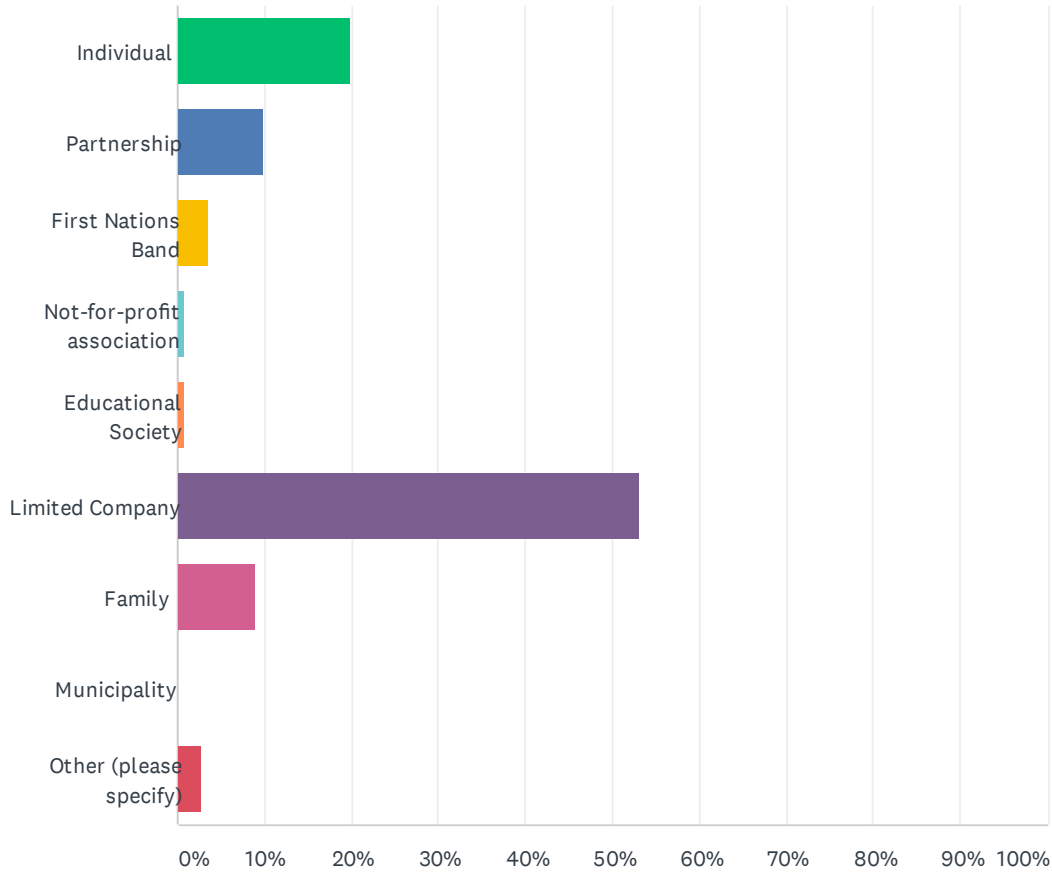

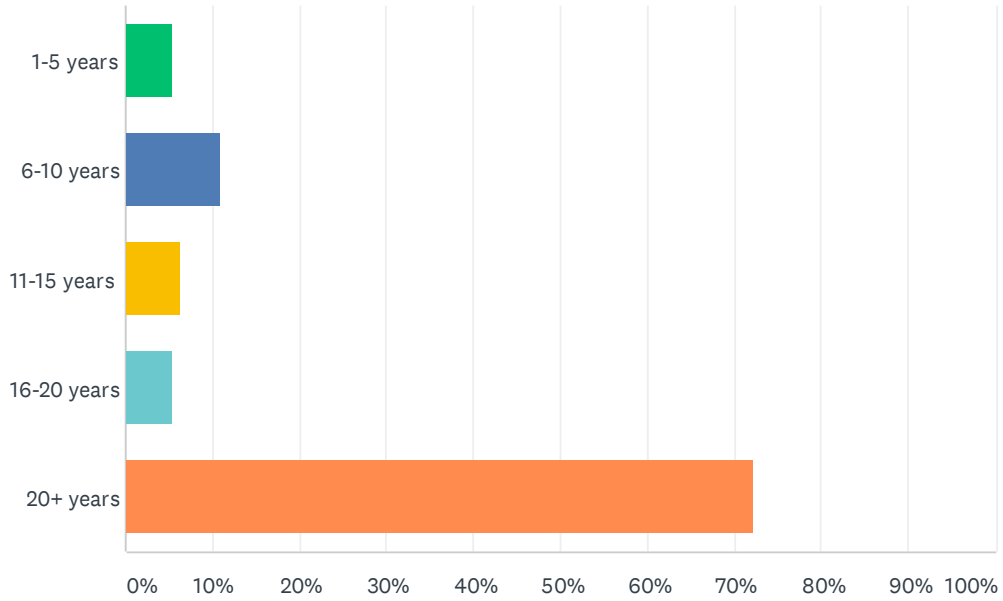

Q7 How long do you plan to hold your woodlot licence?

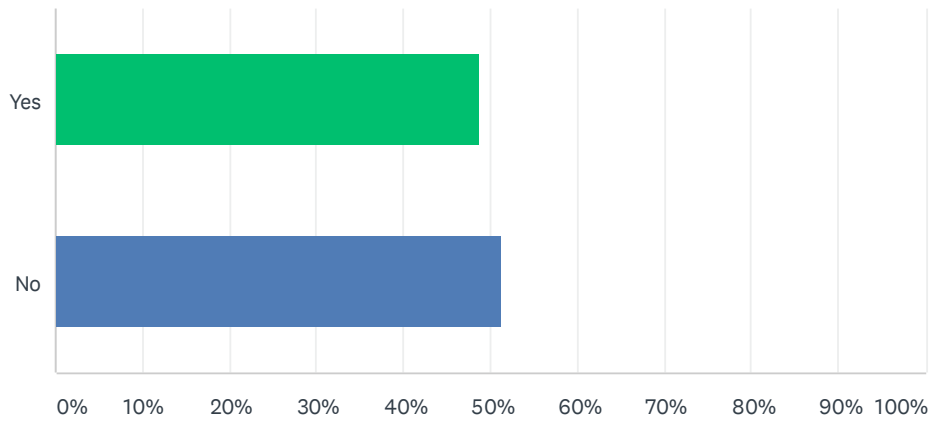

Q8 Do you have a plan in place for the succession or transfer of your woodlot?

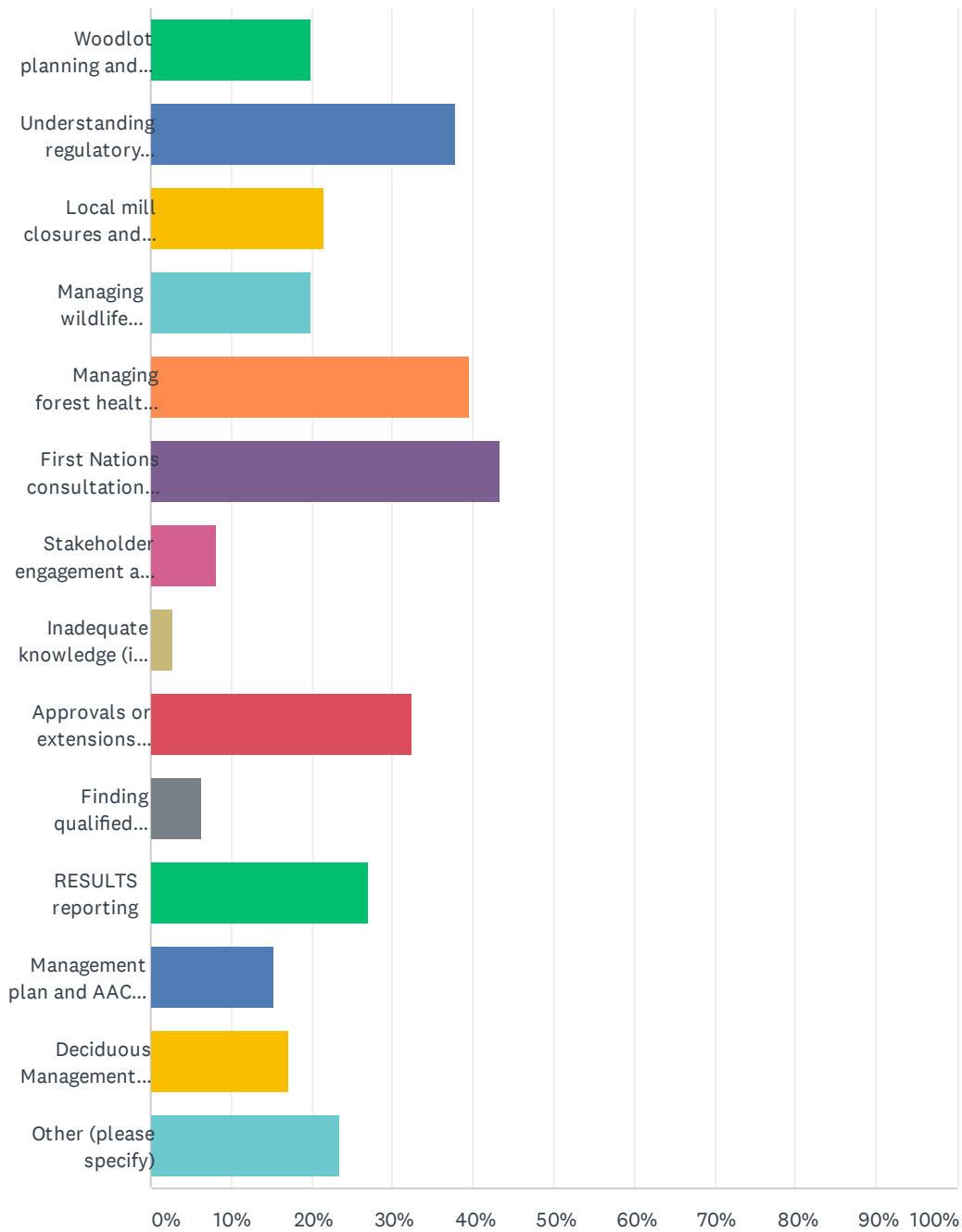

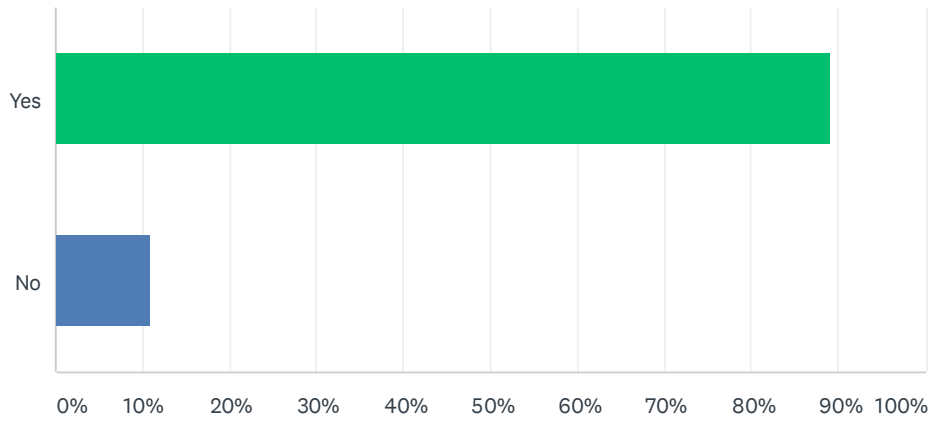

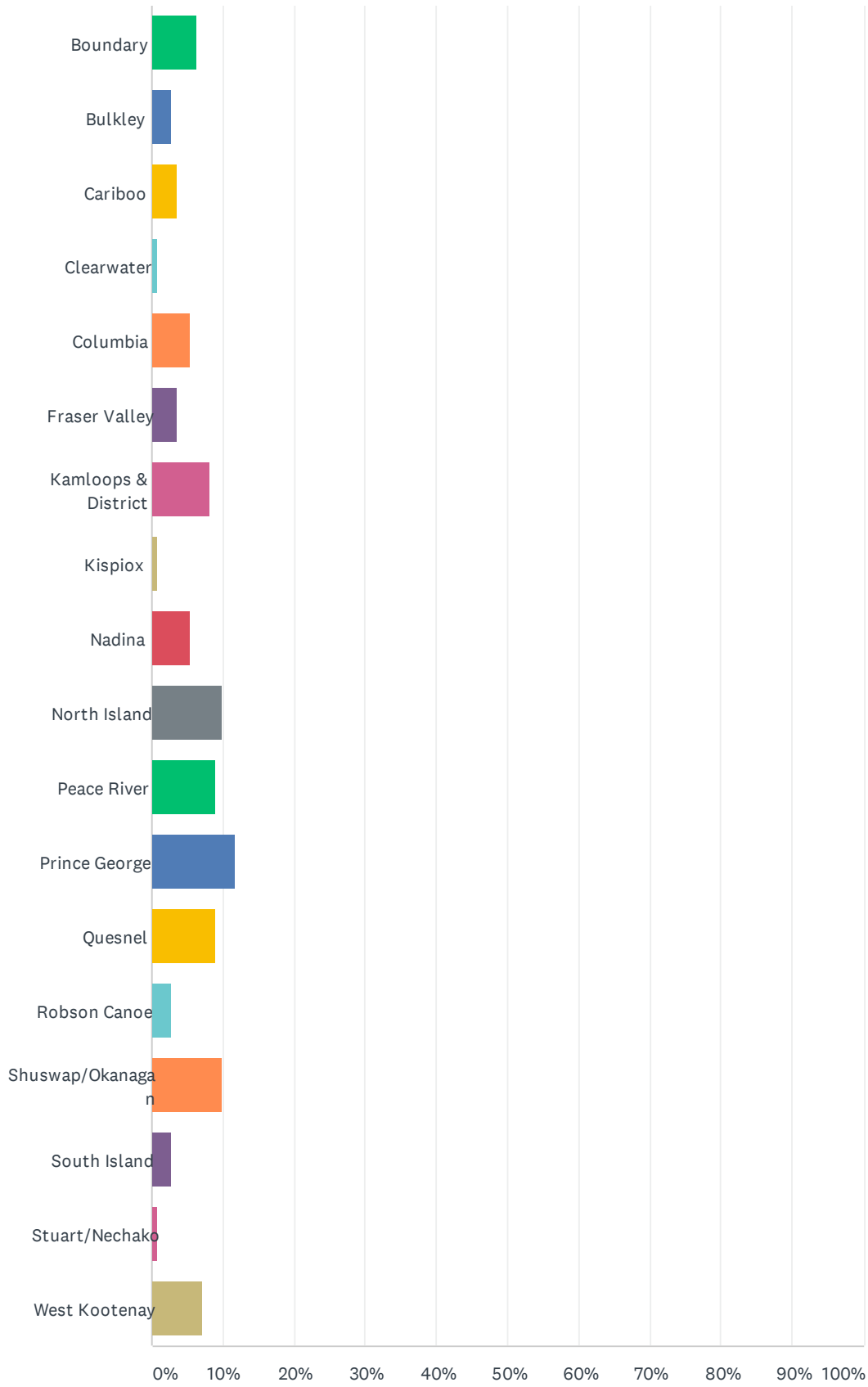

Q11 Based on the location of your woodlot, what woodlot association would represent your interests?

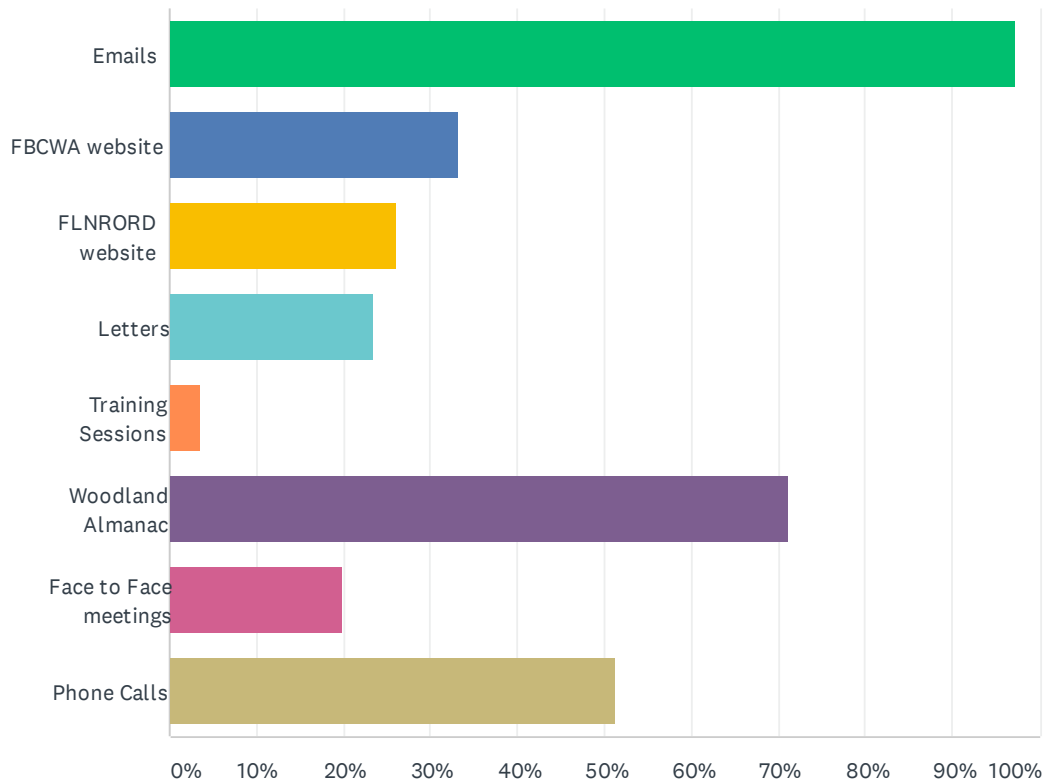

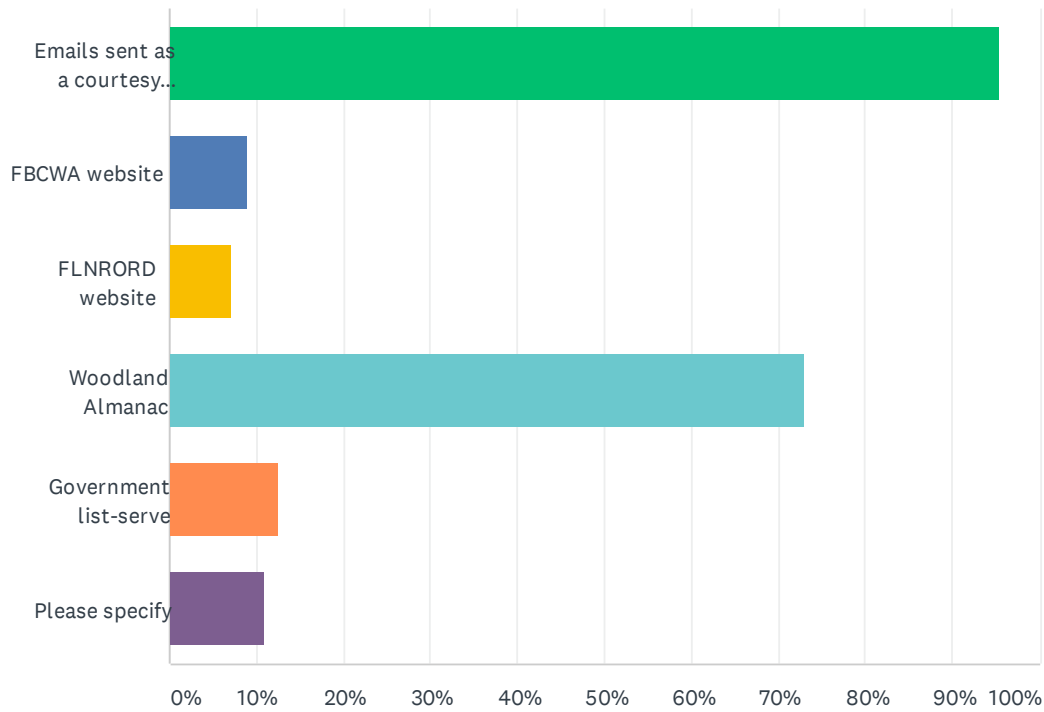

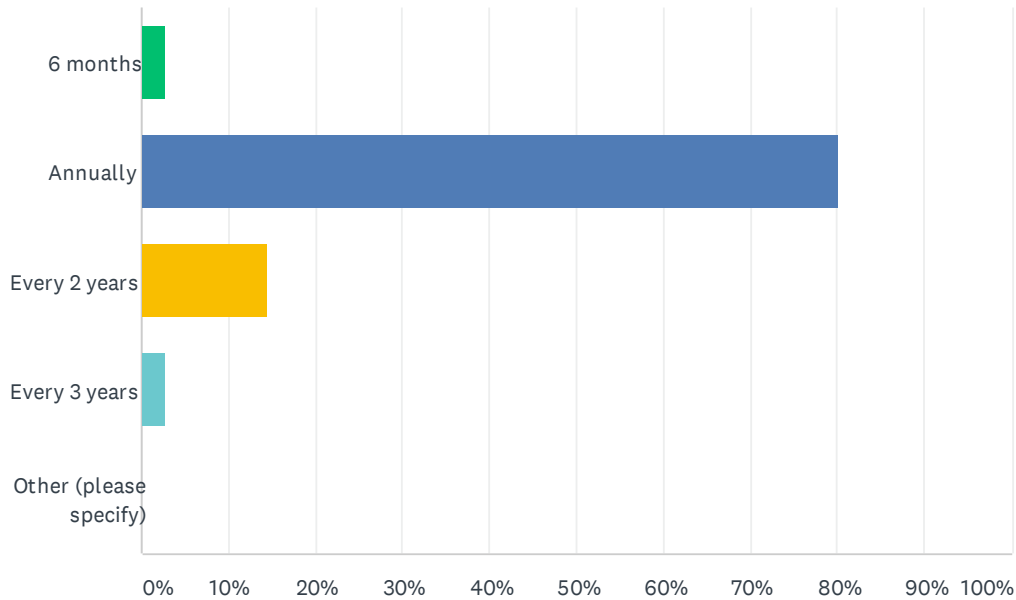

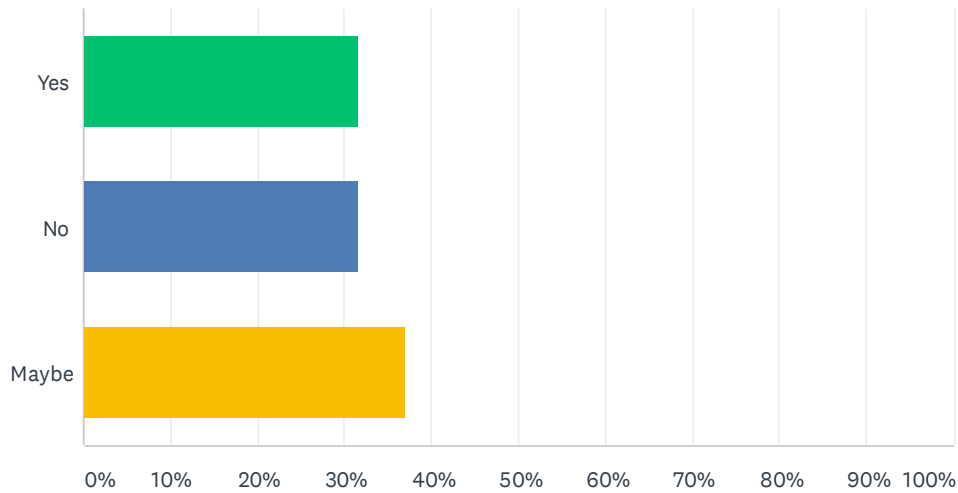

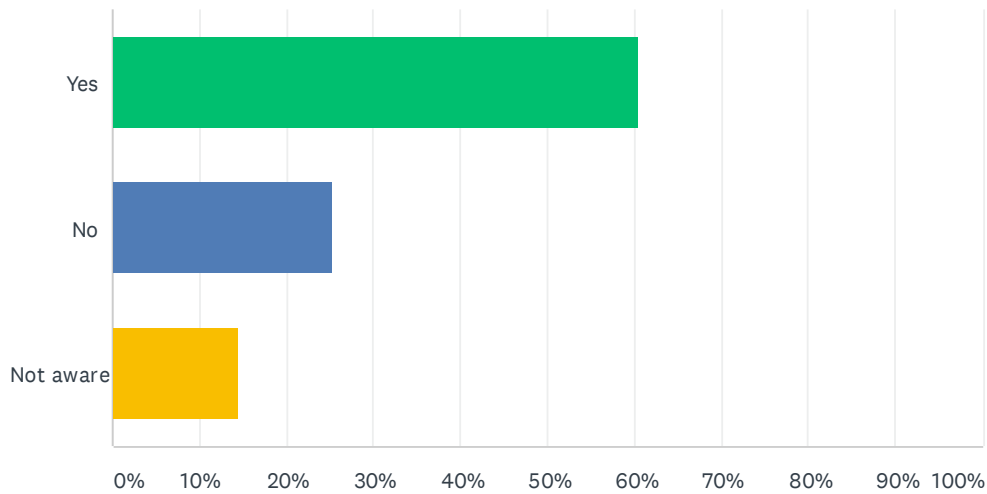
